Cross Country Finishes Undefeated Season With Great Finish at NCAA's

The 1994 version of the MIT Cross Country Team had a simple goal: do not choke in the championships. After 1993's disappointing NCAA Qualifier, the desire to show what the team could have done remained strong throughout the year. Returning only two of last year's top seven meant that a lot of work had to be done in the summer. Team made the commitment to up their mileage from previous summers and to consistently follow a weight training program. Of course, it did not hurt that Ethan Crain '95, out last year with mono, would be returning.

As usual, the season began with the Alumni Meet. What was not so usual, was that the Varsity won. Not only that, but for the first time in a long time, a Varsity member won the individual race (Ethan Crain - 26:19). Terry McNatt '87 (4th) was the only Alum to

break up the Varsity's top 5. The Alumni could use a higher attendance in the future, they had to borrow the services of Bill Singhose in order to have 5 finishers.

MIT traveled to WPI for the annual Engineer's Cup on the following weekend. The Techmen brought the traveling trophy along, but had no intention of leaving it there. MIT displayed their strength by sweeping the first five positions, and that was with one of the top runners getting lost. MIT had no one finishing between 5th and 14th, which was not especially good news in the depth department.

Competing at Tufts usually conjures up many good stories. The only unusual story coming out of this race was the coaches in the lead vehicle nearly stopping the race in their overturned vehicle. Other than a little soreness on Coach Taylor's part, everything was okay. It was probably the Tufts' Coach trying to reverse, the by then, obvious outcome. MIT sent Crain and Darley '95 out front and had its core of 3-6 runners follow the pack foolish enough to try and go with Crain and Darley. The plan worked well as Tech went 1,2,6,7,9,11. Once again there was a :52 gap after the 6th man. It was becoming obvious that the team could not afford any injuries or illnesses.

The fourth consecutive week of competition brought the Tech Harriers to LeMoyne College in Syracuse for the LeMoyne Invitational. In the past, this meet has had great national caliber competition from the New York and New England Regions. This year was no exception. Going into the race, 5 of the teams were ranked in the top 20 for NCAA Division III. This was the first real competition for Ethan and Jesse, and proved that the team's delta was not as good as was previously demonstrated. Ethan ran with some of the best runners in the country (6 of the top 10 at NCAA Division III Championships), but could not quite pull it off, as he lost by 1 second. Jesse ran to a 5th place finish, but then MIT suffered with finishes of 18th (Dan Helgesen '97), 34th (Josh Feldman '97), 35th (Arnold Seto '96), and 37th (Karl Munkelwitz '95). This 2:26 delta was only good for a 3rd place behind RIT and eventual National Champion, Williams College.

After a week off from competition, the Engineers competed in the All Division New England Championship (NEIAAA). This meet has been moved up in the season, in order to allow better participation due to fewer conference championship conflicts. Last year, MIT had placed 6th, but a number of teams such as Providence, Yale, UConn, Harvard, etc. were not in attendance. This year, all were in attendance. MIT was led to a 9th place finish by Ethan Crain, who until he got sick on the course at mile 3 1/2, looked as though he could win it. As it was Ethan ran to a 7th place finish with a 24:40. Jesse was close behind in 17th at 25:08. This time the delta was 2:04 through 6 runners. This was indeed a great race for the Techmen as they were only 17 points behind UMass and 33 behind Providence.

The Constitution Athletic Conference Championship was next on the schedule and MIT was the host. MIT won this race for the fourth consecutive time, with a record score of 19 points. The Engineers lost their number 6 runner, Munkelwitz, for the season, due to a leg injury suffered during the week, so the search was on for a new 6th man. He was not found in this race as the 5th to 6th man delta was 1:11. MIT garnered Athlete of the Year, Ethan Crain; and Coach of the Year, Halston Taylor, for the conference.

Next on the agenda was a trek to Keene, N.H. to race Division II powers, Keene St. and UMass Lowell. Dan Helgesen had been sick all week and was not quite recovered, but finished 9th, leading MIT to what would have been a very close victory over Keene St., MIT's next finisher was 15th. Ethan pulled away after 2 miles and set a course record of 24:42 and was followed by Jesse in 25:09.

The week prior to the National Qualifiers, the team was looking anxious. In fact, the members who were on the team that choked the year before, were thinking this might happen again. Although it seemed a bit late in the season to be doing it, Coach Taylor used the Friends money and hired a sports psychologist to begin working with the team. It seemed to help as the Engineers ran their best race of the year. The only negative was Ethan again getting sick during the race and losing for only the second time to a Division

III athlete. Ethan was 3rd, Jesse 4th, and then a remarkable finish by Helgesen in 21st, Arnold in 25th, and Josh in 26th. MIT placed 2nd, 46 points behind Williams, but 85 ahead of 3rd place Brandeis, earning a trip to the NCAA Championships.

The last time MIT was represented at the NCAA Division III Cross Country National Championship as a team was in 1986. The only race the Techmen compete in that compares to the National Championship is the NEIAAA Championship. In fact, one can predict their place of finish at nationals by their finish at the NEIAAA's. This particular year was no exception.

The course at Lehigh University has a long uphill start. This, along with the fact that it was their first time at nationals, seemed to bother everyone except Ethan and Jesse. It showed at the start, as the rest of the team put themselves in the hole by starting the race in the back. Ethan and Jesse were with the lead group until Ethan once again got sick around mile 3. They still managed to finish 9th and 10th respectively, but looked as though they had plenty left at the finish. Josh managed to fight his way through the sea of runners to finish in 77th position. Dan and Arnold were not so fortunate. They ran out of gas trying to fight the bodies in front of them and finished 91st and 111th respectively. Having their best races of the season were Mark Feldmeier '97 and Tye Schlegelmilch '98. Mark finished within 2:30 of Ethan for the first time this season and Tye was close behind. MIT finished in a tie for 10th with Haverford College. Finishing second in New England did not feel so bad considering Williams College won the National Championship over defending National Champion, North Central College.

The team earned Academic All-America Honors for the second straight year. Earning individual Academic All-America Awards were Jesse and Arnold. Ethan and Jesse won All-America Honors by placing in the top 25. At the awards banquet, Ethan won the 1994 MVP Award and was elected the 1995 Captain.

Next year, among the top 7, only Jesse will not be returning. With a good summer of training, combined with a potentially good recruiting class, MIT hopes to not only make nationals again, but improve on their 10th place finish. There is a possibility that the top 7 may make a trip to the site of the 1995 NCAA Championships in mid season. This of course depends on scheduling possibilities and adequate funds in "The Friends Account".

Indoor Team Competes Over Their Head All Season

The 1994-95 season began with modest goals. Although the roster had numerous star competitors, it was lacking in depth, particularly what would be needed for the eight places scored in the quad cup meets. The feeling was that there were three teams better than the Varsity, Coast Guard, Tufts, and Williams.

As usual, the meets before Christmas break are the JV meet with Naval Academy Prep and the Alumni. Everyone competed in both meets. NAPS did not have many individuals on their team, and it hurt them, as MIT won most of the 2nd places and all of the 3rd places to win the meet.

Bill Singhose '90 and Company showed up with victory on their minds, but in some cases the rest of their bodies were not willing. Bill won his usual four events, (long jump, triple jump, pole vault, and high hurdles) as well as placed second in the 800. John-Paul Clarke '91 won both throwing events and the Alumni 4x200 relay team ran to victory. Those were the only victories and there were not enough bodies on the side of the Alumni to score many 2nd's and 3rd's. Brian Moore '73 can still get the job done, as he placed 3rd behind All-American John Wallberg '96 in both the Weight and Shot Put. Tom Washington '92 was able to earn a 2nd place in the high jump with a leap of 6-2, behind Andy Ugarov '95. Two very willing, but not quite in shape alums, Ayisi Makatiani '90 and Mike Piepergerdes '93 tried to pull out victories, but their bodies rebelled. Makatiani placed 2nd in the 55 meters behind Matt Sandholm '96, and 3rd in the 200 meters behind Malik King '95 and Akin Aina '95. Also placing in the 55 meters for the Has Beens was Jay Chiang '94. Piepergerdes faded in the 1500 to 3rd place behind surprises, Josh Feldman '97 and Richard Rosalez '98. Elliott Mason, who was running for the Alumni, even though he has a season of eligibility in Outdoor Track, placed 2nd in the 400 behind Freshman John Kim. Terry McNatt '87 and Eugene Tung '88 placed 3rd and 4th behind All-Americans Ethan Crain and Jesse Darley in the 5000 meters. Brad Bolivar '94 competed in the talent laden Weight Throw, but did not place. All in all, it was a very competitive meet. The Varsity did not pull away until the last two events, (200 and 5000) when they outscored the Has Beens 16-2.

After four weeks off, the Techmen returned to practice and the low key, non-scoring Beaver Relays. The only impressive performances in the meet on behalf of MIT were Andy Ugarov jumping 6-8 to win the high jump, and Josh Feldman running 8:57 in the 3000 to place second.

The next two weeks were quad meets without much competition. The other teams did not have much depth. In fact, even though there were four teams involved in each meet, some events did not have eight competitors to fill out the scoring places. This is a sad testimony to what track and field has come to for many teams in New England. Since MIT had the limit of four entries in each event, the meets were no contest.

The third quad meet brought about 12 inches of snow. This kept Westfield State and Worcester State from making the trip to Cambridge, turning the meet into a dual meet with Coast Guard. In a quad meet, Coach Halston Taylor thought the Engineers would have a slight edge, but with less scoring places, the edge looked like it belonged to the Cadets. Apparently, Coast Guard thought the same thing and took the outcome of the meet for granted. It appeared the sessions with the Sports Psychologist were beginning to work, as MIT outscored Coast Guard 42-13 after the first five events and never looked back.

Still undefeated, MIT took on their two toughest competitors in Williams and Tufts. Everyone was up for this meet and it showed. Personal bests and national qualifying performances were taking place in many events. Williams had just too much quality and depth to be challenged. MIT however, did have enough to take down Tufts, and finish the regular season 11-1.

The New England Division III Championships were pretty much a battle for second place for the top teams, as Williams was too strong. This was one of the best meets for MIT in Coach Taylor's tenure at MIT. In only it's second year as a part of the scoring events in the NEDiv3's, the Pentathlon saw two last minute entries from MIT (Bo Light '96 and Lincoln Bonner '97) score 5th and 6th respectively. MIT scored in 14 of the 15 events they entered. MVP of the meet, Ethan Crain, led the way by beating Division I transfer, Creaghan Trainer, in both the 1500 meters and the 1000 meters, to win both events. This qualified Ethan for both the NCAA Championships and IC4A's. As predicted, the meet was a battle for second, but only for Coast Guard and MIT. Tufts did not have a very good day and finished in a distant 4th. Coast Guard had many scoring entries in all events other than the

distance events. They built up an early lead and stayed about 4 to 10 points ahead of the Beavers all day, despite national qualifying performances by John Wallberg in the Weight Throw and Matt Sandholm in the 55 meters. The difference was in the relays, as Coast Guard beat MIT in all three. Williams won their fourth consecutive Indoor Title with a record 164 points.

Ethan Crain was not recovered for the All New England's and did not compete. The only place winners were Jesse Darley, setting a Varsity Record in the 5000, placing 4th in 14:48.47; and Andy Ugarov in the Triple Jump (45-7), placing 5th. Jesse's performance qualified him for nationals. Other outstanding, but non-placing performances were turned in by Josh Feldman in the 5000 meters (15:08.84), Joel Ford '98 in the 800 meters (1:58.67), and Edgar Ngwenya '96 also in the 800 meters (1:57.04).

Ethan and Andy Ugarov were the only MIT Athletes making the trip to Princeton for the IC4A's. Ethan entered the 1000 in hopes of building some speed prior to nationals. It seemed all of the good milers had the same idea, as the 1000 was loaded with talent. Ethan ran great in the trials and made the finals with a Varsity Record of 2:27.52. In the finals, they took it out and Ethan was not able to stay with the leaders, but was able to hold on for the last scoring place (8th) in another Varsity Record of 2:27.14. Andy had not yet qualified for nationals and was determined to do so. On Andy's 3rd and last jump, he leapt to a personal best of 46-00 3/4, qualifying him provisionally for nationals.

Three individuals made the strict national qualifying standards, (top 11 in the country) Ethan in the 1500, Jesse in the 5000, and John Wallberg in the Weight Throw. Although Andy and Matt had qualified provisionally, they did not make the cut off. On Friday night, Ethan ran through the trials easily in 3:59.43. Jesse did not have the same good fortune as he did not quite place in the finals. John not only placed 4th, but threw his personal best with a throw of 55-3 1/2. John barely made the finals, but came through on his second throw in the finals to move up to 4th. In the 1500 finals, Ethan decided to try the same strategy that he used in winning the Outdoor National Championship, taking off with 1000 meters to go. It worked almost as well this time, but he lost some intensity with about 350 meters to go, and was passed by the eventual winner in both the 1500 and the 800, Karl Paranya from Haverford. Ethan tried to come back on him, but could not do it, placing 2nd in 3:54.41.

At the Awards Banquet, Ethan was elected Team MVP. Voting for captains was complicated by the redshirting next year of Matt Sandholm and John Wallberg, but the team picked two very capable members in Hung Hoang '96 and Edgar Ngwenya.

Outdoor Season: Even Better Than Indoor

The 1995 Outdoor Track Season began with the Spring Trip to California. The first stop was to Palo Alto for the Stanford Invitational. The competition was a little overwhelming for most of the team, but Ethan and John qualified for nationals right off the bat. Ethan set personal bests in both the 1500 (3:51.66) and the 800 (1:55.98). Everyone enjoyed the great weather and competing again after the layoff from Indoor Track.

Mid-week the Engineers made their way down to Claremont to train with and compete against Pomona Pitzer and Claremont Mudd Scripps Colleges. Once again, the weather was remarkable. This time the cobwebs were dusted off, and the team competed well. Numerous NE Div.3 qualifying performances were achieved, John increased his qualifying performance in the hammer, and the jumpers showed evidence of a low gravity area, as four of them long jumped more than 20', with Hung Hoang '96 leading the way at 21-4 1/2.

Returning to New England was a rude awakening. The first meet back was at RPI's new facility. The Engineer's Cup was to be the first meet ever on the track, and MIT wanted to break it in properly. The Techmen were greeted by 40 degree temperatures, strong winds, and occasional rain mixed with snow. Nice day! However, while the other teams were complaining about the weather, MIT was scoring points. Not a single complaint was heard from the Beavers as they continued to be the only team to ever win this meet.

Next, the Engineers made their way, for what may be the last time, to the Williams Relays. Sitting at an eight hour meet and traveling for another six hours is not the best way to enhance one's team performance. Regardless of the lousy weather conditions some great performance were turned in. Ethan and Jesse ran the 3000 Steeplechase for the second time ever and ran 9:19.0 and 9:46.0 respectively. This qualified Ethan for nationals in his second event. Also running great was Matt Sandholm in the 100 and 200. Matt won both, setting a Varsity Record in the 200 with a time of 21.65. This gave Matt the fastest time in the country for Division 3 at that time of the season.

MIT had not defeated Tufts outdoors in the two years they had been meeting them. Tufts had not lost an outdoor regular season meet in five years. This all came to an end on April 22nd at MIT. The meet was tied going into the 800, when MIT broke the Jumbos' back by sweeping the 800. Tufts only managed to win two events after that as Tech pulled away. John Wallberg scored 10 points in winning the Hammer and Shot Put. In the Hammer, John totally by-passed the 180's and threw 193-00. In the Shot, John pulled it out on his last throw with a 45-8 1/2 to beat a favored Tufts' thrower. Ethan won both the 1500 and 800, Matt won both the 100 and 200 and Andy won both the High Jump and Triple Jump. In winning the Triple Jump, Andy set a personal best, and missed national qualifying by 1 centimeter with a jump of 46-07. Jesse did not win two events, but nevertheless ran a great double in winning the Steeplechase and placing second in the 5000.

With a 4-0 record and an opportunity to have the first undefeated Outdoor Team since 1990, MIT was not taking any chances. Springfield always gives the Engineers a good meet, so even though the Chiefs had not had a great season, Coach Taylor prepared his troops for the worst. The Techmen responded with outstanding performances all day. Crain and Sandholm won their two events as usual, and Wallberg not only won three events, but threw the discus 151-07 for a huge personal best. MIT swept the Pole Vault and the Long Jump, and went 8-1 in the High Jump and 400. The meet was never close as MIT finished 5-0.

The New England Division III Championships were held at Tufts University. Again, it seemed the battle would be for second place, between MIT, Tufts, and Coast Guard. This turned out to be true. Williams was just too strong, as they set a record with 173 points. Tufts had a great meet and too many quarter milers, earning a well deserved 2nd place with 107 points. MIT successfully battled it out with Coast Guard for 3rd with 72 points to Coast Guard's 65. Key performers for MIT were Sandholm winning the 100 and getting 3rd in the 200, Crain winning the 1500 and placing 3rd in the 800, Ugarov winning the Triple Jump and earning a 3rd in the High Jump, and Wallberg winning the Hammer and placing 5th in the Discus, and 6th in the Shot Put. Gutsy performances, by a not quite recovered from injury, Josh Feldman; and a sick Arnold Seto, in the 10K, earned them 3rd and 5th respectively.

Only those who had either qualified for nationals or who had a chance to do so competed at the NEIAAA Championships. The only place winners were Ethan in the 3000 Steeplechase, Andy in the Triple Jump, and John in the Hammer. Ethan was trying to run a good enough time in the Steeplechase to convince himself and Coach Taylor that it would be worthwhile to try doubling at the NCAA Championships. The weather was not ideal and neither was Ethan. Although he ran a personal best of 9:08.04 and placed 2nd, it was too much work to risk the double at nationals. John had a pretty good throw of 189-03 in the Hammer, but could not quite put it all together. The pressure of trying to qualify for the National Championships in the last competition, got to Andy, as he could only manage a 44-10 3/4 in the Triple Jump.

Heading out to Minnesota for the NCAA Championships were Ethan Crain in the 1500, Matt Sandholm in the 200, and John Wallberg in the Hammer. Matt had to compete on the first day in the 200 Meter Trials. It was Matt's first time at the "Big Show" and it showed. He got out of the blocks okay, but soon tightened up, and lost a lot of ground in the final 100 meters. Matt has two more seasons of eligibility in Outdoor Track. Even though he plans on redshirting next year, due to a year in Europe, he intends on returning to the National Championships and doing much better.

On Thursday, John had not had very good warm-ups for the past couple of days prior to the qualifying round, and it showed. He fouled his first of three throws, but got in a safety throw of 180-04 to make it Saturday's trials. Ethan had an easy trial as expected, cruising home in 3:56.04.

Saturday's finals began with John in the Hammer. It was raining, cold, and very windy; conditions John was accustomed to. He threw a good safety throw, and then 183-05 on his second throw. John's third throw would have been a great one, but he leaned forward just a little, causing the ball to strike the ground. He still threw over 170'. In the finals it began raining harder and John could not put everything into it. He finished third behind two William's seniors, whom he has battled many times. John has another shot at the championship. Even though John plans on redshirting the Indoor season, his plans are to compete Outdoors.

Ethan's plans to take the race out and come through in 61 second quarters, had to be abandoned because of the weather. The decision to get out with the leaders, but run from behind was the plan. Apparently everyone else had the same idea. Ethan got stuck in front even slowing to a 68 quarter did not force anyone to take the lead. The wind was too much and when the other runners decided to go, Ethan could not respond. The best he could do was fifth. Even though he ran a 2:03 final half, he only produced a final time of 3:59.48.

At the Team Awards Dinner, Ethan added the MVP award to his Cross Country and Indoor MVP's. Andy Ugarov won the Paul McKenzie Award. Most Improved went to Bo Light, and the JV Award was won by Todd Chamoy '98. Captains for next year will be John Wallberg and Hung Hoang.

Institute Awards were won by Jesse Darley (Student-Athlete of the Year), and Ethan Crain (Athlete of the Year). Jesse has also been elected to the GTE AT Large Team, Academic All America First Team for his efforts in Cross Country and Track. Congratulations to all these fine individuals.

Please remember the Alumni Cross Country Meet at Franklin Park on September 9, and the Alumni Indoor Meet on December 9.
